In sailing, PO I. Clarke and AC R. Thompson were 5th in the Canadian National Open Albacore Championships.

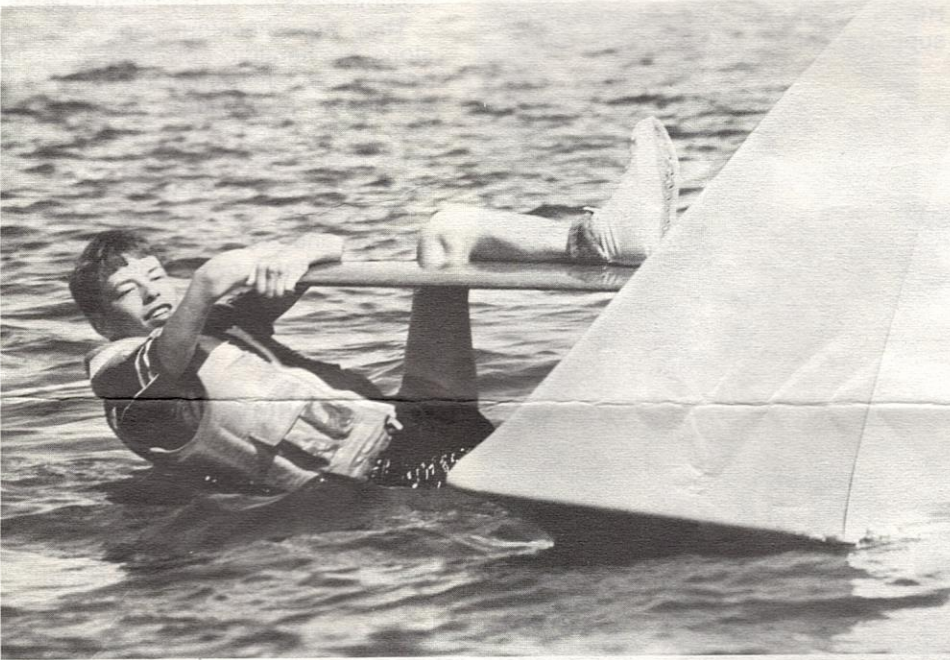
The Corps participated in community activities such as the Heart Fund drive, Santa Claus parades, and Remembrance Day and Battle of the Atlantic ceremonies.
