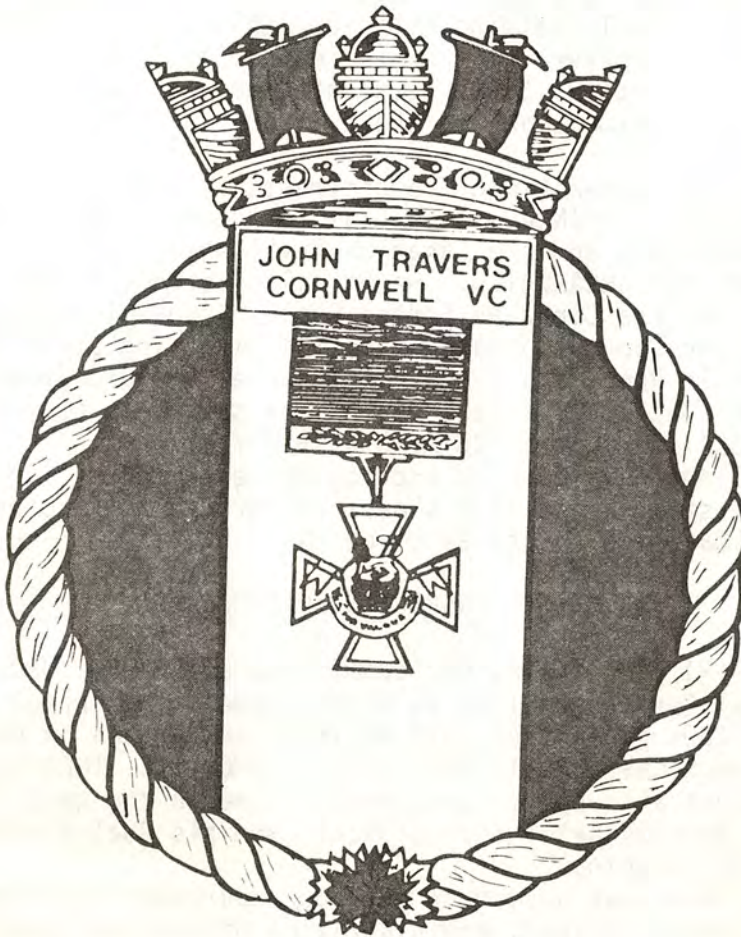

INSPECTING OFFICER

Capt.(N) R.A. Darlington, CD, is the senior serving regular force officer who is an ex-member of RCSCC JOHN TRAVERS CORNWELL VC. Capt.(N) Darlington was born in Winnipeg and educated here earning his degree in 1949 from the University of Manitoba. Capt.(N) Darlington had served in JTCVC from 1941 to 1947 as both a cadet and an officer becoming a Sub. Lieutenant and Executive Officer of a Ship's Company. In 1945, he had also enrolled in the University Naval Training Division (UNT D's) as an Officer Cadet. In August of 1948, he received his commission and transferred to the Royal Canadian Navy as an Acting Sub. Lieutenant. He was trained at the RCN Supply School in Esquimalt and at the U.S. Supply Corps School in Bayonne, New Jersey.

His career has taken him on appointments as Supply Officer on HMCS BEACON HILL and HMCS GATINEAU as well as to the U.S. Naval Aviation Supply Office in Philadelphia and the Canadian Naval and Aviation Supply Depots in Montreal and HMCS SHEARWATER. He has also served at Training Command HQ in Winnipeg and the Canadian Forces Supply School in Borden. He has also served as the Deputy Commandant of the Directing staff of the NATO Defence College in Rome, Italy and in Personnel and Procurement appointments at NDHQ in Ottawa. Since 1978, he has served as Deputy Chief of Staff (Logistics) in Maritime Command at Halifax.

Capt. Darlington is married and has three children, a daughter at Dalhousie University, a son in business in Toronto and another son serving in the Canadian Forces as Lieut.(N).

INSPECTING OFFICER

Commander (R) C.E. Thain, CD, Commanding Officer of HMCS CHIPPAWA joined the Naval Reserve in 1957 as a UNTD Cadet. He served his summer training in various capacities both on shore and at sea on board HMCS SWANSEA, HMCS CAPE SOCTT, HMCS LAUZON, HMCS STE. THERESE and HMCS ST. CROIX. He has also spent considerable time on the gate vessels and has earned his Reserve Watchkeeping Ticket and his Qualification in Naval Control of Shipping.

Commander Thain has served in various departments within Chippawa as well as Personnel Officer, Administration Officer and Executive Officer. He was promoted to Commander (R) in January of 1977 and in September of 1978 assumed command of HMCS CHIPPAWA.

In civilian life Cdr. Thain is a Reading Specialist with the Fort Garry School Division and has taught part-time with the Department of Education at the University of Manitoba.

Cdr. Thain and his wife Jean reside in Fort Garry with their three children.

CORPS HISTORY

R.C.S.C.C. "JOHN TRAVERS CORNWELL V.C." came into being in 1920 first known as the Boys' Naval Brigade. It then was known for many years as the Winnipeg Sea Cadets. When the actual name was selected in the 1940's, no more fitting name could be used than that of the 16 year old boy seaman of the Battle of Jutland who died of wounds received at his post on a gun of HMS CHESTER. His display of courage in his youth earned him the Victoria Cross as gazetted Sept. 15th, 1916;

Boy, First Class, John Travers Cornwell, O.N.J. 42563, for the conspicuous act of bravery specified below.

"Mortally wounded early in the action, Boy, First Class, John Travers Cornwell remained standing alone at a most exposed post, quietly awaiting orders, until the end of the action, with the gun's crew dead and wounded all round him. His age was under sixteen and a half years."
