### JOHN TRAVERS CORNWELL VC

At the height of the Battle of Jutland on 31 May 1916, Boy First Class John Travers Cornwell stood at his gun aboard HMS Chester. With his gun's crew dead and dieing, the boy seaman, 16 years of age, remained at his most exposed post for orders that never came. It was here he received his mortal wound. It was this act of bravery that earned him the Victoria Cross, the highest military award in the Commonwealth.

His action inspired a nation trapped in a war to end all wars. Today his action still inspires a sea cadet corps that proudly wears his name. Formed in 1920 as the Boy's Naval Brigade, the Royal Canadian Sea Cadet Corps JOHN TRAVERS CORNWELL VC has a proud history of dedicated service to the youth of our great country.
