Commander Hinshaw began his cadet career in Winnipeg with JRK Millen Navy League Cadet Corps before moving to Kelowna, BC and joining RCSCC Grenville in 1970. He attended HMCS QUADRA and Esquimalt Sea Cadet Camp as a cadet during the summers of 1970 through 1974.

In 1975, Commander Hinshaw attended the 11 week Officer Cadet Course at HMCS Quadra, and was commissioned in October of that year. Commander Hinshaw remained active with RCSCC Grenville until 1980, serving as Boats Officer, Training Officer and Executive Officer. He also served as Training Officer in RCSCC Revenge in 1975/76.

During the summer training periods between 1976 and the present, Commander Hinshaw served the majority of his time in Quadra's flotilla. He attended the Tender Command Course in 1977 and received his Command Certification that summer. While working in the flotilla, he commanded various ships and also served as Senior Commanding Officer afloat. In his final three years in the flotilla, he was the Flotilla Commander. Commander Hinshaw served as the Executive Officer in HMCS Quadra until his appointment to Commanding Officer in March 1988.

Commander Hinshaw graduated from Kelowna Senior Secondary School and obtained his post-secondary education at Camosun College in Victoria and the University of Victoria. He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in 1985, completing a double major in Economics and Political Science.

## JOHN TRAVERS CORNWELL VC

At the height of the Battle of Jutland on 31 May 1916, Boy First Class John Travers Cornwell stood at his gun aboard HMS Chester. With his gun's crew dead or dieing, the boy seaman, 16 years of age, remained at his most exposed post for orders that never came. It was here he received his mortal wound. It was this act of bravery that earned him the Victoria Cross, the highest military award in the Commonwealth.

His action inspired a nation trapped in a war to end all wars. Today his action still inspires a sea cadet corps that proudly bears his name. Formed in 1920 as the Boy's Naval Brigade, the Royal Canadian Sea Cadet Corps JOHN TRAVERS CORNWELL VC has a proud history of dedicated service of the youth or great country.
