LIEUTENANT COMMANDER ELLIOTT F. SMITH, CD

Lieutenant Commander Smith was born in Liverpool, Nova Scotia 17 December 1945 and graduated from Liverpool Regional High School in 1964. He joined the Royal Canadian Navy Short Service Officer Plan at HMCS VENTURE in Esquimalt and on graduation entered the Fleet in October 1966.

Lieutenant Commander Smith has served in HMC Ships JONQUIERE, GATINEAU, COLUMBIA, ST. LAURENT, RESTIGOUCHE and IROQUOIS. Although he is a Specialist Weapons Officer, he has served as Navigation Officer, Operations Officer, Weapons Officer, Combat Officer and Squadron Combat Officer in HMC Ships.

In 1975 Lieutenant Commander Smith was appointed to National Defence Headquarters as a Staff Officer to Chief Maritime Doctrine and Operations. This assignment was followed in 1979 by a posting to Fleet School in Halifax as Officer in Charge of the Tactics Division of Fleet School, where he remained until 1981, when he served on the staff of the Maritime Commander. In June 1983 Lieutenant Commander Smith was appointed to the Commander of the Canadian Forces Station Shelburne, where he served until August 1986. After a one year posting to the Canadian Patrol Frigate Programme Lieutenant Commander Smith was posted to the Regular Support Staff of HMCS CHIPPAWA.

Lieutenant Commander Smith is married to the former Barbara Sletter, of Ottawa, and has two children.

JOHN TRAVERS CORNWELL VC

At the height of the Battle of Jutland on 31 May 1916, Boy Seaman First Class John Travers Cornwell stood his station at this gun aboard HMS Chester. With his gun's crew dead and dying the boy seaman, 16 years of age, remained at his most exposed post for orders that never came. It was here he received his mortal wound. It was this act of bravery that earned him the Victoria Cross, the Commonwealth's highest award. His action inspired a nation trapped in a war to end all wars.

RCSCC John Travers Cornwell VC came into being in 1920 first known as the Boy's Naval Brigade. It then was known for many years as the Winnipeg Sea Cadets. In the 1940's the name John Travers Cornwell VC was selected and today continues a proud history of dedicated service to the youth of our great country.
