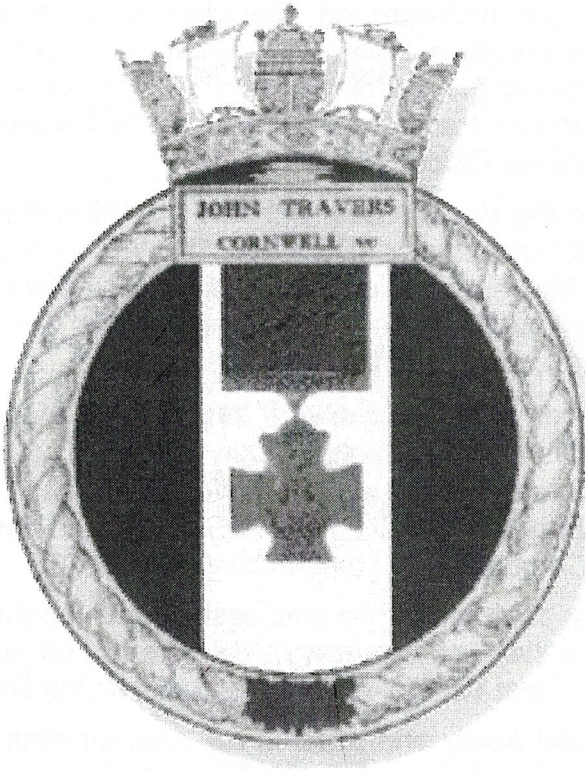

Reviewing Officer LCdr T.M. Lonsdale

LCdr Lonsdale joined the Canadian Forces in September 1981 as an Air Defence Technician, applied for Officer Training two years later and was commissioned as an Air Weapons Controller in June 1984.

After tours in the underground Canadian North American Aerospace Defence facility at North Bay, Ontario and inside Cheyenne Mountain at the Missile Warning Centre in Colorado Springs, Colorado, she voluntarily transferred occupations to become a Maritime Surface Operations Officer in 1991.

She served on the Pacific coast onboard HMCS ANNAPOLIS as a Bridge Watchkeeper and HMCS VANCOUVER as the Above Water Warfare Officer and later Deck Officer completing numerous three and four month deployments in support of the UN off Haiti and to conduct exercises in the Western Pacific.

In 1999, after completion of the year long Operations Room Officer Course in Halifax, Nova Scotia, LCdr Lonsdale completed a six month-deployment with the International Forces East Timor (INTERFET) onboard HMCS PROTECTEUR and then assumed duties as the Combat Officer of HMCS VANCOUVER.

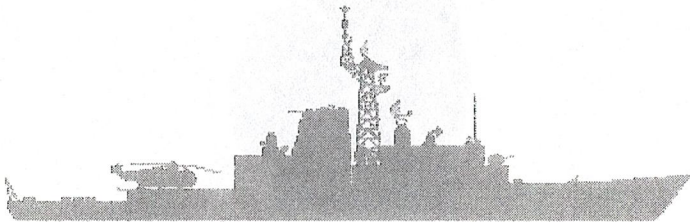
In July 2001 on completion of a successful three-month exercise off Australia and a live Sea Sparrow missile firing, she joined the Canadian Forces Fleet School – Basic Recruit Training Division.

In July 2003 and newly promoted to her present rank, LCdr Lonsdale was posted to 1 Canadian Air Division Headquarters as the Naval Liaison Officer, a post she will hold until July 2004 when she will be posted to National Defence Headquarters in Ottawa, Ontario.

LCdr Lonsdale hails from the village of Marshall, Saskatchewan, where she was an Air Cadet for several years in high school, and is a graduate of the University of Manitoba.

Formed in 1920 as the Boys' Naval Brigade

- 1923 The name was changed to Winnipeg Sea Cadets
- 1943 The name John Travers Cornwell, V.C. was officially adopted by the corps
- 1952 HMCS Quadra is used as summer training establishment by cadets
- 1954 The Navy League was formed, and named J.K.Millen after the third Commanding Officer of RCSCC John Travers Cornwell Corps
- 1975 Integration of females into the cadet movement
- 1983 Freedom of the City of Winnipeg RCSCC John Travers Cornwell VC is one of the very few Sea Cadet Corps in Canada to have earned the Freedom
- 2004 One of the finest and most recognizable Sea Cadet corps in Canada
