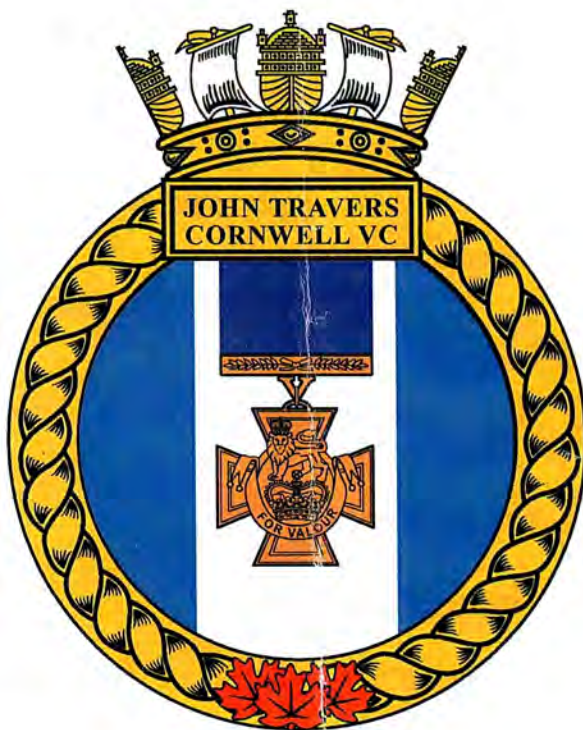

## **REAR-ADMIRAL JENNIFER J. BENNETT, CMM, CD – CHIEF RESERVES AND CADETS**

Rear-Admiral Jennifer Bennett enrolled in the Naval Reserve in 1975 in HMCS STAR as a Naval Communicator.

On enrolment to McMaster University, Hamilton, Ontario, in 1977, Rear-Admiral Bennett transferred from service in the lower deck to the Naval Reserve Officer Cadet programme for training as a Logistics Officer; she was commissioned as a Sub-Lieutenant in August 1979.

Rear-Admiral Bennett graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education from McMaster University in 1981, a Bachelor's Degree in Education from Queen's University in 1982 and a Master of Arts in Leadership and Training from Royal Roads University in 2005.

Rear-Admiral Bennett has served consistently in the Primary Reserve, including service in Naval Reserve Divisions HMCS STAR, HMCS CATARAQUI and HMCS MALAHAT. She graduated from the Canadian Forces Staff School, Toronto, in 1985, the Canadian Forces Staff College, Toronto, in 1989 and the NATO Defence Staff College in 1999.

Service with Maritime Command includes staff positions with the Naval Reserve Training Centre, Officer Training Division, KATIMAVIK, Maritime Forces Pacific Headquarters and on the Directing Staff of the Canadian Forces Staff College.

Promoted to Commander on January 1st, 1995, concurrent with a command appointment, Rear-Admiral Bennett served as Commanding Officer HMCS MALAHAT until July 30, 1998. On completion of her term in command, she was appointed the Branch Advisor for support trades and served on the staff of the Commander Naval Reserve for two years. During the 1999 summer training period, she served as the Commanding Officer Naval Reserve Basic Recruit Training Detachment Borden.

Rear-Admiral Bennett was promoted to Captain(Navy) on January 1st, 2000 upon appointment as Director Reserves under the Chief Reserves and Cadets at National Defence Headquarters. In September 2003, she joined the Headquarters staff of the Canadian Defence Academy as Director of the Ottawa detachment. Concurrent with these duties, Rear-Admiral Bennett also served as a Naval Reserve Regional Coordinator for the Laurentian and Pacific Regions. Other appointments in National Defence Headquarters include Director of Training and Education Policy and Project Director (Military) for the Defence Learning Network.

Rear-Admiral Bennett was promoted to Commodore on December 1st, 2007 upon her appointment as the Commander Naval Reserve. She was promoted to her current rank in April 2011 and appointed Chief Reserves and Cadets in May 2011.

In civilian life, Rear-Admiral Bennett has been employed as an administrator and teacher in elementary and secondary schools in Ontario and British Columbia. Rear-Admiral Bennett is following a Naval Reserve family tradition of over a century of service in the Naval Reserve in that her father served for thirty years and her sister and brother are serving members.

## **JOHN TRAVERS CORNWELL VC**

At the height of the Battle of Jutland on 31 May 1916, **Boy Seaman First Class John Travers Cornwell** stood his station at his gun aboard HMS Chester. With his gun's crew dead and dying, the boy seaman at sixteen remained at his most exposed post for orders that never arrived. It was here he received his mortal wound. This act of bravery earned him the Victoria Cross, the Commonwealth's highest honour. His action inspired a nation trapped in a war to end all wars.

RCSCC John Travers Cornwell VC was formed in 1920, first known as the Boys Naval Brigade. It was then known as the Winnipeg Sea Cadets. In the 1940's the name John Travers Cornwell VC was selected, and today the corps continues a proud history of dedicated service to the youth of our great country.

The Annual Ceremonial Review is a culmination of a year's hard work. Through ACR 2013, the cadets and officers show respect for our history and commitment to the future of this corps. As I come to the end of my final year as Commanding Officer I must thank my wife and family, the cadets, my officers, all the staff at RCSU (Northwest), the NL Branch, HMCS Chippawa, and my friends for their unwavering support and loyalty to the corps and myself these last three years. And to the parents and friends of the cadets, thank you for showing your support to them this evening as you have to the corps throughout the year.
