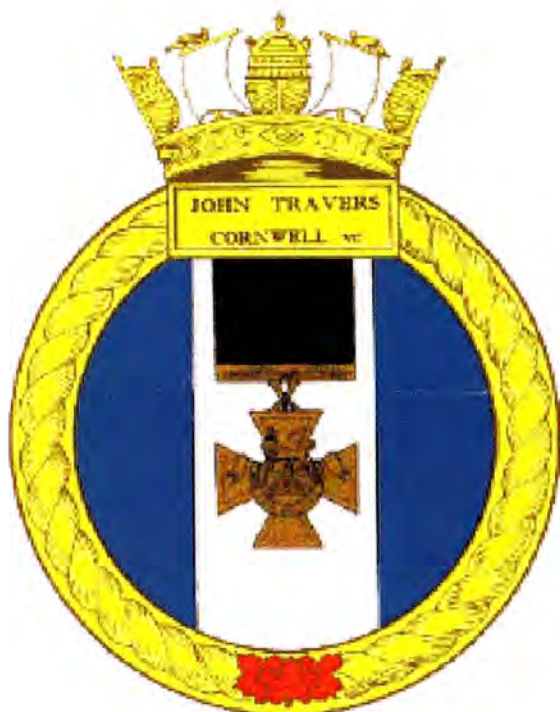

Biography of Major Dallas Jay West, **Reviewing Officer**

Major West was born on 8 January 1971 in Regina, Saskatchewan. At the age of 13 he joined the Canadian Cadet Organizations with 2370 Royal Canadian Army Cadet Corps. He attended summer courses at Camp Saskadet and the Vernon Army Cadet Summer Training Centre before graduating from the program in 1989. Prior to graduating from cadets he joined the Primary Reserve in June of 1988 and, after completing his basic military and trades training, he served with 10th Field Royal Canadian Artillery Regiment until transferring to the Cadet Instructor Cadre to become an officer with 2370 in July 1990.

Major West served eleven years at the corps level filling various roles including five years as the Training Officer and four years as the Commanding Officer. He has served nineteen summers at both the Regional and National Cadet Summer Training Centre level including one in Cold Lake at the Aircrew Survival School where he served as a Security Officer, ten in Vernon where he served three summers as a Platoon Commander, two as a Company 2IC and five as a Company Commander and eight at the Rocky Mountain National Army Cadet Summer Training Centre where he served four summers as the Adjutant and two as the Deputy Commanding Officer prior to being promoted to Acting Lieutenant-Colonel and appointed Commanding Officer on 19 August 2011. This summer will mark his twentieth summer tasking and the completion of his tenure as the Commanding Officer of Rocky Mountain.

Major West has served full time with Regional Cadet Support Unit (Northwest) on Class B Reserve Service for over fifteen years including nine at the Detachment level and six at the Regional Headquarters level. He has filled various roles including Part Time Directing Staff at Region Cadet Instructor Schools (Prairie) and (Pacific), Assistant Area Cadet Officer (Army), Area Cadet Officer (Army), Common Training Officer and Region Cadet Training Officer (Army). In September 2008 he was promoted to Major and appointed Region Cadet Training Services Officer where he served until being appointed the Officer in Charge of Common Training following the

unit's organizational restructure on 1 April 2009. On 1 April 2011, he was reappointed to the position of Training Services Officer with overall responsibility for all aspects of cadet and adult training within the Region. On 2 December 2013 he was appointed Corporate Services Officer where he is responsible for all personnel and administrative matters within the Region. Major West resides in Winnipeg, Manitoba with his wife Vinessa and their daughter Ella Patricia.

JOHN TRAVERS CORNWELL VC

At the height of the Battle of Jutland on 31 May 1916, **Boy Seaman First Class John Travers Cornwell** stood his station at his gun aboard HMS Chester. With his gun's crew dead and dying, the boy seaman at sixteen remained at his most exposed post for orders that never arrived. It was here he received his mortal wound. This act of bravery earned him the Victoria Cross, the Commonwealth's highest honour. His action inspired a nation trapped in a war to end all wars.

RCSCC John Travers Cornwell VC was formed in 1920, first known as the Boys Naval Birgade. It was then known as the Winnipeg Sea Cadets. In the 1940's the name John Travers Cornwell VC was selected, and today the corps continues a proud history of dedicated service to the youth of our great country.

The Annual Ceremonial Review is a culmination of a year's hard work. Through ACR 2014, the cadets and officers show respect for our history and commitment to the future of this corps.

As this is my first year as Commanding Officer I would like to thank my Family, the Cadets, my Officers, all the staff at RCSU (NW), the NL Branch and HMCS Chippawa for their support and loyalty to the corps and myself.
