#### HMCS Chippawa's Naval Field Gun & Carriage JTC's Gun Crew

Hey JTCers' how many of you remember JTC's Gun Crew. Well the old gun and carriage are still at Chippawa. The 12 Pound Shell Quick Firing Gun was built in England in 1898. That's right, 1898! How many of you remember pulling, lifting, stomping, running, sweating, standing and kneeling proudly with that old naval piece of history? Do any of you remember smelling the smoke and watching the smoke rings soar when blanks were fired? I bet there are a few stories and pictures that many of you have relating to the JTC's Gun Crew.

The gun and carriage have many interesting nameplates and etchings. There is a huge piece of history sitting there to be remembered. When I was taking pictures of the nameplates,



# Naval Terminology

Mind Your Ps and Qs – In the past, when sailors were paid and went ashore for liberty, the tavern keepers knew how much they were paid. They'd keep tally of a sailor's beer consumption by marking up 'P' for pints and 'Q' for quarts, then settling up with the sailor at the end of the evening. If a sailor failed to 'mind his Ps and Qs,' he'd come up short (or perhaps be cut off by the bartender).

Irish Pennant - (1) (RN) Loose mop strings left in the flat. May be seen as 'Irish Pendant.' (2) More generically, any dangling or loose thread on a uniform, or lines left adrift or dangling from the upper works or rigging of the ship.

Head – Marine toilet. In its original form, toilet facilities were found right forward in the bows, so that the smell would be blown downwind and away from the ship (since sailing ships could not lie directly into the wind when underway). The extreme fore part of a ship was known as the "beakhead," which may have been shortened to "head" over time.
