
ANNUAL INSPECTION

Corps History

RCSCC John Travers Cornwell VC came into being in 1920 first known as the Boys' Naval Brigade. It then was known for many years as the Winnipeg Sea Cadets. When the actual name was selected in the 1940's no more fitting name could be used that that of the 16 year old boy seaman of the Battle of Jutland who died of his wounds received at his post on a gun of HMS CHESTER. His display of valour in his youth earned him the Victoria Cross as gazetted 15 Sep 1916.

Boy, First Class, John Travers Cornwell, O.N.J. 42563, for the conspicuous act of bravery specified below.

"A report from the Commanding Officer of the Chester gives a splendid instance of devotion to duty. Boy, First Class, John Travers Cornwell was mortally wounded early in the action. He nevertheless remained standing alone at a most exposed post, quietly awaiting orders till the end of the action, with the gun's crew dead and wounded all round him. His age was under sixteen and a half years."
