Lieutenant (N) S. Chadwick CD

Out-Going Commanding Officer

Lieutenant (N) Chadwick was born in Winnipeg in 1967. She joined RCSCC John Travers Cornwell VC in 1982. As a cadet, Lieutenant (N) Chadwick participated in the Guard, Drill Team and First Aid training and spent summers training at HMCS QUADRA as course cadet and as a staff cadet.

Lieutenant (N) Chadwick joined the officer cadre of JOHN TRAVERS CORNWELL VC in 1986 and was commissioned in 1987. She held various positions in the corps including Guard Officer and Admin Officer. Summers were spent on the shores of Lake Winnipeg as Administration Officer at HMCS GIMLI. In 1990 her career with Transport Canada necessitated leaving the corps and Winnipeg for a number of northern postings, including a two-year sojourn as the Admin Officer for 889 RCACS La Ronge and a posting to Resolute Bay, NWT. Returning to Winnipeg in 1996 Lieutenant (N) Chadwick rejoined the corps as the Training Officer and later as Executive Officer. In 1997 she assisted in the formation of RCSCC Dawson and was awarded the Canadian Forces Certificate of Appreciation for services rendered to the Cadet Movement.

Lieutenant (N) Chadwick is a Flight Service Specialist with Nav Canada. She is pursuing a degree in History at the University of Manitoba.

Commander C. Michon CD - Reviewing Officer

Commander Claude Michon was born in St. Boniface, Manitoba in 1950. After completing high school at l'Ecole Louis Riel, he enrolled in the Canadian Forces and attended Royal Military College in Kingston, Ontario. He graduated in 1972 with a Bachelor of Arts degree. He then started his career as a Naval Logistics Officer. He served at various naval shore establishments and served a total of seven and a half years at sea on four different ships: HMCS IROQUOIS, HMCS PRESERVER, HMCS SKEENA and HMCS ALGONQUIN. His last tour at sea included two four-month deployments with NATO's Standing Naval Force Atlantic. He then served with NATO forces at CFB Lahr, West Germany for four years. Commander Michon's last posting with the Regular Force was as the Staff Officer Logistics at Naval Reserve Headquarters in Quebec City. Following that posting he transferred to the Naval Reserve and served at HMCS CHIPPAWA in Winnipeg from 1989 to 2004. In CHIPPAWA, he served in various Logistics and Training appointments and was appointed as the Executive Officer from 1995 to 1998. Commander Michon assumed command of HMCS CHIPPAWA on 1 September 2000, a post he held until July 2004. Commander Michon is currently a Liaison Officer with the Canadian Forces Liaison Council. He is also serving as an Honourary Aide-de-Camp to the Lieutenant Governor of Manitoba.

Commander Michon's civilian career started in Winnipeg in 1989 in the field of supply chain management for healthcare facilities. He is currently the Manager of Logistics Services for the Winnipeg Regional Health Authority.

Commander Michon is married to Kathleen (nee Robertson). They have two children, Diane and David. Diane graduated from the Royal Military College in Kingston and received her commission as a Naval Officer. David is currently studying at the University of Winnipeg.

Lieutenant (N) K. Daeninck CD

Incoming Commanding Officer

Lieutenant (N) Daeninck was born in Winnipeg in 1973. He joined RCSCC John Travers Cornwell VC in 1988. He participated in a wide variety of cadet activities from Guard, Range, Drill Team, Guns Crew, Biathlon and Band. A Boatswain by trade, summers were spent at HMCS Gimli and HMCS Quadra in sunny Comox. He completed his cadet career in 1992, achieving the position of RPO and the rank of CPO2.

The call of the corps was impossible to resist, and he returned to the corps as a volunteer after a short stint with HMCS Chippawa. He held various positions within the corps including Divisional Officer and Training Officer. Lieutenant (N) Daeninck has served in both HMCS Qu'Appelle and HMCS Quadra summer camps in various capacities. He completed the Tender charge course in 1996 and spent the following 2 summers Flotilla at HMCS Quadra, achieving his board certification as a Vessel OIC in his final year. He returned to HMCS Qu'Appelle as Operations Officer and was CADMO in 2004, the final year of the camp. In 2006 he was selected as the exchange officer to Japan. Lieutenant (N) Daeninck was a major force in the formation of RCSCC Dawson in 1997 and was awarded the Canadian Forces Certificate of Appreciation for services rendered to the Cadet Movement.

Lieutenant (N) Daeninck graduated from the University of Manitoba in 1991 with a Bachelor of Education degree. He is currently a teacher in Winnipeg school division. He is married to Sarah.
