
Royal Canadian Sea Cadet Corps John Travers Cornwell Victoria Cross

Boy Seaman 1st Class John Travers Cornwell VC



CORNWELL, JOHN TRAVERS, Boy, First Class, Royal Navy, was born on 8 Jan. 1900, at Leyton, son of Eli and Alice Cornwell. He was educated at Walton Road School, Manor Park. He wished to be a sailor when he left school, but his parents could not bear the thought of losing him so soon so he bravely turned to the work that lay to his hand, and became a boy on a Brook Bond's tea van. He was also a keen Boy Scout, and held two certificates. When the European War broke out his father promptly joined the Army, and Jack Cornwell was given his chance to join the Navy. He went through preliminary training at Devonport from 27 July, 1915 and became a First Class Boy on HMS Chester for active service in Admiral Beatty's North Sea Squadron. A few months after Jack Cornwell joined his ship, Admiral Beatty came to grips with the German High Seas Fleet near Jutland 31st May 1916; he was mortally wounded in action, and died two days later in Grimsby hospital. He was posthumously awarded the Victoria Cross [London Gazette, 15 Sept. 1916]: " John Travers Cornwell, Boy (First Class), O.N. J.42563: Mortally wounded early in the action, Boy, First Class, John Travers Cornwell remained standing alone at a most exposed post, quietly awaiting orders, until the end of the action, with the gun's crew dead and wounded around him. His age was under sixteen and half years."

Biography for Reviewing Officer LCdr Remi Tremblay CD, CTDP, B.Ed, MDE

LCdr Remi Tremblay was born in Wawa, Ontario in 1972. He moved to the small town of Courval, outside of Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan in 1976. In 1986 he joined the Royal Canadian Sea Cadet Corps Assiniboine in Moose Jaw. In 1990, LCdr Tremblay was accepted into the Canadian Forces under the Regular Officer Training Program (ROTP) where he completed his Bachelor of Education at the University of Saskatchewan. In 1995, LCdr Tremblay was posted to CFB Borden to attend his Training Development Officer (TDO) Basic Training at the Canadian Forces Training Development Center (CFTDC). Following his basic training he remained at CFTDC and fulfilled roles as a Senior Instructor, Project Officer and R&D lead in the use of training technology. In July of 2000, LCdr Tremblay was posted to 17 Wing Winnipeg as the Wing Ground Training Officer. In 2004, LCdr Tremblay was accepted into the Post Graduate Training (PG) Program and completed his Masters of Distance Education from Athabasca University in 2006. Following the completion of his PG he was posted to the Canadian Forces School of Aerospace Studies (CFSAS) as the school TDO and is currently fulfilling the role of Deputy Commandant.
