

# Lieutenant-Commander D.M.C. Fitzpatrick (David), CD Officer In Charge Sea Training Regional Cadet Support Unit (Prairie)

LCdr David Fitzpatrick is originally from Dublin, Ireland and moved to Winnipeg, Manitoba with his family in 1976. He first joined the Navy League Cadet Corps "J.R.K. Millen" as a cadet in 1977. He later joined the Royal Canadian Sea Cadet Corps "Crusader" in 1979, finishing as a cadet Chief Petty Officer Second Class and joining the ranks of the Cadet Instructor Cadre in 1985.

LCdr Fitzpatrick commissioned in 1988, has served with two sea cadet corps in Manitoba, RCSCC CRUSADER and RCSCC QU'APPELLE. He was the Executive Officer of RCSCC CRUSADER, and has held training and support positions at these corps, the Regional Cadet Instructor School (Prairie) and at Cadet Summer Training Centre's.

Prior to commencing full-time employment with RCSU (Prairie) LCdr Fitzpatrick worked as an Office Manger for Law Reporting Transcription Services and previous to that as a Draftsman for a Mechanical Systems Manufacturer, CL Malach LTD upon completion of the Drafting Certificate Program at Red River Community College in 1988.

LCdr Fitzpatrick joined Region Cadet Staff Establishment (Prairie) in 1992 serving as the Staff Officer Cadet Boats until 2007, when he became the Regional Cadet Training Officer (Sea).

LCdr Fitzpatrick was appointed to his current position Officer In Charge Sea Training on 1 April 2009.

LCdr Fitzpatrick is married to the former Michelle Wain and they have three children – daughters Victoria - (1994), Shona - (1996) and son Michael - (1999).



### JOHN TRAVERS CORNWELL VC

At the height of the Battle of Jutland on 31 May 1916, Boy Seaman First Class John Travers Cornwell stood his station at his gun aboard HMS Chester. With his gun's crew dead and dying the boy seaman at sixteen remained at his most exposed post for orders that never arrived. It was here he received his mortal wound. This act of bravery earned him the Victoria Cross, the Commonwealth's highest honour. His action inspired a nation trapped in a war to end all wars.

RCSCC JOHN TRAVERS CORNWELL VC was formed in 1920 first known as the Boy's Naval Brigade. It was known for many years as the Winnipeg Sea Cadets. In the 1940's the name, JOHN TRAVERS CORNWELL VC, was selected, and today the corps continues a proud history of dedicated service to the youth of our great country.

The Annual Inspection is a culmination of a year's hard work. Through Annual Inspection 2012 the cadets and officers show a respect for history and a commitment to the future of this proud corps. Thank you for showing your support this evening.
